As most of you will be aware, this year marks the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Club's formation and we have been celebrating this milestone in the Club's history with a series of special events.

Our official birthday shoot was the Club's annual "Rat's Ashes" Open American tournament which was held on Sunday 10 July 2016, with over 80 archers from all over the Midlands taking part.

### **SCOA Annual Sheriff's Western – Sunday 4 September 2016**

There was another good turnout for our annual Sherriff's Western on Sunday 4 September 2016, again with nearly sixty archers enjoying a relaxed afternoon's shooting – apart from Tony Carter that is who had a number of equipment issues – three broken arrows and his release aid fell apart during the latter part of the afternoon! However, despite this, after being ahead for much of the competition, he still managed to hang on to take joint first place in the Gents Compound.

Other SCOA successes were Keith Raybould who was awarded the first class medal in the Gents Longbow and Stourbridge juniors Rachel Turner and Joe Woodridge who were both awarded medals in their respective categories.

A special mention also to Elaine Archer and Wayne Barrass. This was their first open shoot and they both acquitted themselves well – Elaine gaining her second class classification and Wayne who only started shooting after this year's beginners' courses, was awarded the SCOA Novice Trophy. Well done, guys!

Associate member Alan Broadley of Stafford also took part and was awarded the first class medal in the Gents Recurve.

### **Upcoming Club Shoots (Club Members only)**

September is a busy month for Club shoots with the **All-Comers' Warwick** on **Sunday 18 September 2016** and the **Derek Peacock Memorial Longbow Shoot** the following **Sunday, 25 September 2016**.

The All-comers' Warwick is designed to encourage newer members and those with larger handicaps. It's handicap adjusted (for newer members, this means that each archer is given an allowance at the beginning of the shoot, based on their handicap – the larger your handicap, the bigger the allowance you have to start with and just for good measure, we sometimes make more experienced archers shoot longer distances too!). As it says on the tin, the round is Warwicks and sighters will be at 2.00 pm – although please try to arrive at around 1.30 pm to help set out the field.

The Derek Peacock Memorial Shoot is the Club's annual longbow shoot which is held in memory of longstanding Club member and former Records Officer, Derek Peacock. It's a two way Western and all archers must shoot longbows. (Don't worry if you don't have one, as hopefully, you'll be able to borrow one from someone that has). Placings are decided using BLBS rules (British Longbow Society), with the winner being the archer with the highest number of hits; the archer in second place will be the one with the highest score and third place will be awarded to the archer with most golds. Again, sighters will be at 2.00 pm, but please arrive early to help set out the field.

If you don't have a longbow and would like to take part in the Derek Peacock shoot, please let Peter Langmaid know ([peter.langmaid@tiscali.co.uk](mailto:peter.langmaid@tiscali.co.uk)) and similarly, if you have any spare longbows that you are able to loan to a Club member for the afternoon, again, please let Peter know.

### **If you go down to the woods today .....**

A small group of SCOA archers took part in the Club's annual field shoot at March Hare, Throckmorton on Saturday 7 May 2016.

I don't normally go to this particular shoot, but thought that I would give it a go this year and I'm really glad that I did, as I really enjoyed it. ## Handicap Improvement Trophy

Don't forget that the Club awards a Handicap Improvement Trophy for the archer with the most improved outdoor handicap each year. To be eligible for this, you must have had a handicap on 1 January and submit scores for 8 outdoor rounds to the Records Officer before 31 December. (Rounds must be shot at the appropriate distance for age / gender, with one end of sighters and only one score can be submitted per day).

This year's trophy will be awarded in early 2017 and so if you would like to emulate last year's joint winners, Jeremy Wakefield and Rachel Turner (pictured left), get shooting!!

In the unfortunate event that you lose an arrow on the field, please make every effort to find it – there are plenty of metal detectors, rakes etc. in the Clubhouse.

If after an exhaustive search you really can't locate the missing arrow, please inform Bob Hanson or another Committee member, so that a sweep of the field can be organised.

Arrows left on the field could pose a significant hazard for the footballers which could result in injury and in these days of blame culture, a potential claim against the Club or you as an individual!

Also, please remember that all carbon arrows must not be used at Somers.

## **Away Shoots**

During the Summer, the County of Worcester runs an inter-club competition with seven nominated local open tournaments. Clubs submit their team scores from each of these and the best five are used to compile a league table - the Club with the most points taking the trophy. Last year, we failed to have enough archers for a team at some of the competitions (the only bright spot being that Tony Carter was joint winner of the individual Gents Trophy across all bow types which was not bad going, since he was only able to shoot the first three rounds of the Summer Cup, though he took maximum points from the rounds he did shoot).

Unfortunately this trend of poor attendance at away shoots has continued into 2016 and at some shoots, there has been little or no SCOAA representation. However, those that have taken part have achieved some success and this can be summarised as follows.

### **Redhill Archers Open American – Monday 2 May 2016**

Four Stourbridge archers (Peter Langmaid, Mark Johnson, Reg Paget and Rachel Turner) took part in Redhill's 43<sup>rd</sup> Open American and despite the field turning into a bit of quagmire at one stage, Mark Johnson did really well to get the third class Gents Compound medal (particularly as he finished in fifth place overall and had a higher score than both the first and second class medal winners!). Rachel Turner also did well - first in the Junior Ladies' Recurve category for the Junior American. Well done guys!

### **Wyre Forest Company of Archers – Open Western – Sunday 5 June 2016**

Three Stourbridge archers (Tony Carter, Michelle Hall and Rachel Turner) had an enjoyable day at Wyre Forest's Open Western, enjoying some warm and sunny conditions, despite a bit of a breeze. This was Tony's first away shoot following a long absence due to ill-health and he did extremely well, finishing joint first in the Gents Compound.

### **Droitwich Archery Society Summer Tournament – Sunday 26 June 2016**

Tony Carter and Michelle Hall were the Club's only representatives at Droitwich's Summer Tournament. Shooting the Albion round was quite challenging in the extremely blustery conditions, but despite this, Tony took the second place medal in the Gents Compound and Michelle came home with the Ladies Compound Trophy.

### **CWAA County & Open Championships – Sunday 7 August 2016**

SCOAA's representation was further depleted at the County Championships, with only Rachel Turner carrying the flag for SCOAA! Rachel shot the Bristol 3 round for Girls Under 16 Recurve and did well to bring home a gold medal.

### **Redditch Company of Archers Open Windsor – Sunday 21 August 2016**

Tony Carter and Michelle Hall were once again SCOAA's only representatives at Redditch's Open Windsor. Conditions were extremely difficult with strong winds, but despite this, Tony did well to take the Gents Compound second place medal, having led for much of the competition. Stafford member Alan Broadley who is an Associate member of SCOAA also did well to take the third place medal in the Gents Recurve.

Hopefully, we will have better attendance at indoor away shoots over the coming winter, so that we can have a good showing in the Garrington Cup – an inter-club competition for the winter season run by the County.

## Subscriptions

Hopefully, you have already paid your Club subscriptions for membership year commencing 1 October 2016. However, if you haven't yet done so, please contact our Membership Secretary, Steve Knight, as a matter of urgency.

Subscriptions for 2016 / 17 are £102.00 for Senior Members (aged 25 years and over); £35.00 for Senior Members (aged 18 to 24 years inclusive) and £20.00 for Juniors (Under 18's). All of the above include all affiliation fees, i.e. Archery GB, WMAS and CWAA.

As you will see, we now have two classes of Senior membership – Senior (aged 25 years and over) and Senior (aged 18 to 24 years inclusive) which reflects changes which Archery GB will be making to their membership structure with effect from 1 October 2016.

**Associate Members who pay their affiliations via another Club will need to send a copy of their Archery GB card to the Club Secretary ([michelle@eitmail.co.uk](mailto:michelle@eitmail.co.uk)) before 1 October 2016 and will not be permitted to shoot at Somers or our indoor sessions until they have produced proof that their Archery GB affiliations have been paid.**
